LODGE REPORTS

Hoh-squa was the first stop of your two roving reporters. From their council office in Sharon, they traveled nearly 200 miles to attend this our 12th Annual III-B Meeting. Although this is not their largest attendance at an area meeting, they are here with 37 members. Their major criticism was the wide separation of cabins and buildings.

Deer Rock of campsite #2 was our second trip. Oil City, 140 miles away was their starting point. This seems to be their largest turnout in recent years of 39 men. Well done DEER ROCK. They would like to see more signs erected.

Ah'tic became our next destination. DuBoise:80 miles away is their Council office. Although they have had larger turnouts, they brought 37 arrowmen. They think this meeting is "as good as any yet".

Wopsonosock hails from Alcona only 76 miles distant. They are here with 37 members this year. Their reaction to our conference "Wonderful".

Eriez reports in from the Washington Trail Council of Erie. They are here with 54 boys. They say it is their smallest group in years. This may be due to a long traveling distance of 216 miles. They claim that although our activities started slowly this morning, it is picking up steam and getting better.

Allegewi Lodge hails from Bradford, a distance of 175 miles. This is their largest group they have had at a III-B meeting. 40 men in all are here. They love the meals but claim "Mike's Coney Island Red Hots" are much to snail.

Gyantwachia (Corn Planter) pulled in from Warren, a travel of 175 miles with 14 Boys. Their one word impression of our conference and camp is "GOOD".
