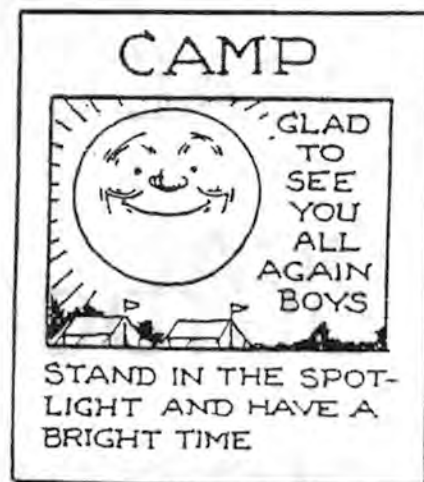

INTRODUCTION

This Northeast Regional Directory of Local Council Camps and Outdoor Facilities has been prepared to assist Scouting leaders with their planning of a varied, interesting, and educational year-round program of camping and outdoor activities.

The Cub Scout Outdoor Program provides an opportunity for parent-Cub activities, day camps, weekend Cub-parent campouts and extended Cub/Webelos camping. Normally adequate facilities are available close to their home community.

The successful Boy Scout Outdoor Program normally provides one overnight camping experience a month and at least a week of extended camping each year. This directory should help leaders to plan a diversified camping program utilizing a variety of Scout camps for both weekend and summer camping.

Many Explorer posts find that an outdoor program experience is important for a well balanced program. Many council camps have Exploring facilities available. This directory should assist in locating those camps.

SECURING INFORMATION OR MAKING RESERVATIONS

The usual procedure is to contact the local council which owns the facility in which you are interested. Write or phone the local council indicating the dates you may want to use the facility. The council will mail you detailed information, including travel directions, rental fees, and availability of facilities for the dates you have indicated, along with a facility reservation form, and two copies of the "Local Tour Permit Application" (National Form #4426 -- (see back page for sample). The addresses and phone numbers are listed with each camp.

When leaving your council area you are required to file a local or national tour permit. Should you decide to make reservations you must complete the Tour Permit Application in duplicate as well as the reservation form and forward them to your local council office. Your local council will approve the tour permit application, retain a copy for their records and forward a copy with the reservation to the council having the facilities you desire to reserve. The approved tour permit will also be mailed to you so that you will know that your reservation has been approved and processed by your local council. This procedure must be followed whenever you use the facilities of another council for any purpose. The completed tour permit is required by the council you will be visiting.





HIGH ADVENTURE FACILITIES

The High Adventure Programs of the Boy Scouts of America are provided for older Scouts (13 years by January 1) and Explorers. Their programs are challenging and conducted in wilderness environments. One high adventure area in the Northeast Region is the Adirondack Association of Scout Camps.

The AASC is located in the 4,000,000 acre New York Adirondack Park. This program includes canoeing, sailing, wilderness backpacking, mountain climbing, white water rafting, rappelling, rock climbing and bushwacking. HOW TO USE THIS DIRECTORY

Geographical Sections

The directory is organized into 10 state or multi-state sections. A schematic map of each state showing the approximate location of each local council outdoor facility can be found at the beginning of each new section. Each facility is identified with its name and a numerical code. The numerical code is the permanent National number assigned to each local council. The geographical sections are:

1. Connecticut
2. Maine
3. Massachusetts and Rhode Island
4. New Hampshire and Vermont
5. New Jersey (North and South)
6. New York (Adirondack Section; Catskills, Eastern New York and Metropolitan/Long Island Sections; Central and Western Sections)
7. Pennsylvania (East and West)
8. Maryland and parts of Virginia
9. Puerto Rico and Virgin Islands
10. Transatlantic

Please note: Facilities are listed in the section in which they are located which, in many instances, is different from the location of the council territory and office.

OUTDOOR FACILITY INFORMATION GUIDE

Basic information on each facility can be found by locating the local council's camp location and name in the left hand column on the pages following each map. The last two columns provide the name and number of the council, its address and phone. Each council's facilities located in a state is listed in first column giving the name of the community in which it is located with the facility listed under the location. The second column gives the total acreage comprising the facility.

Water Area

The coding for the column head water area is:

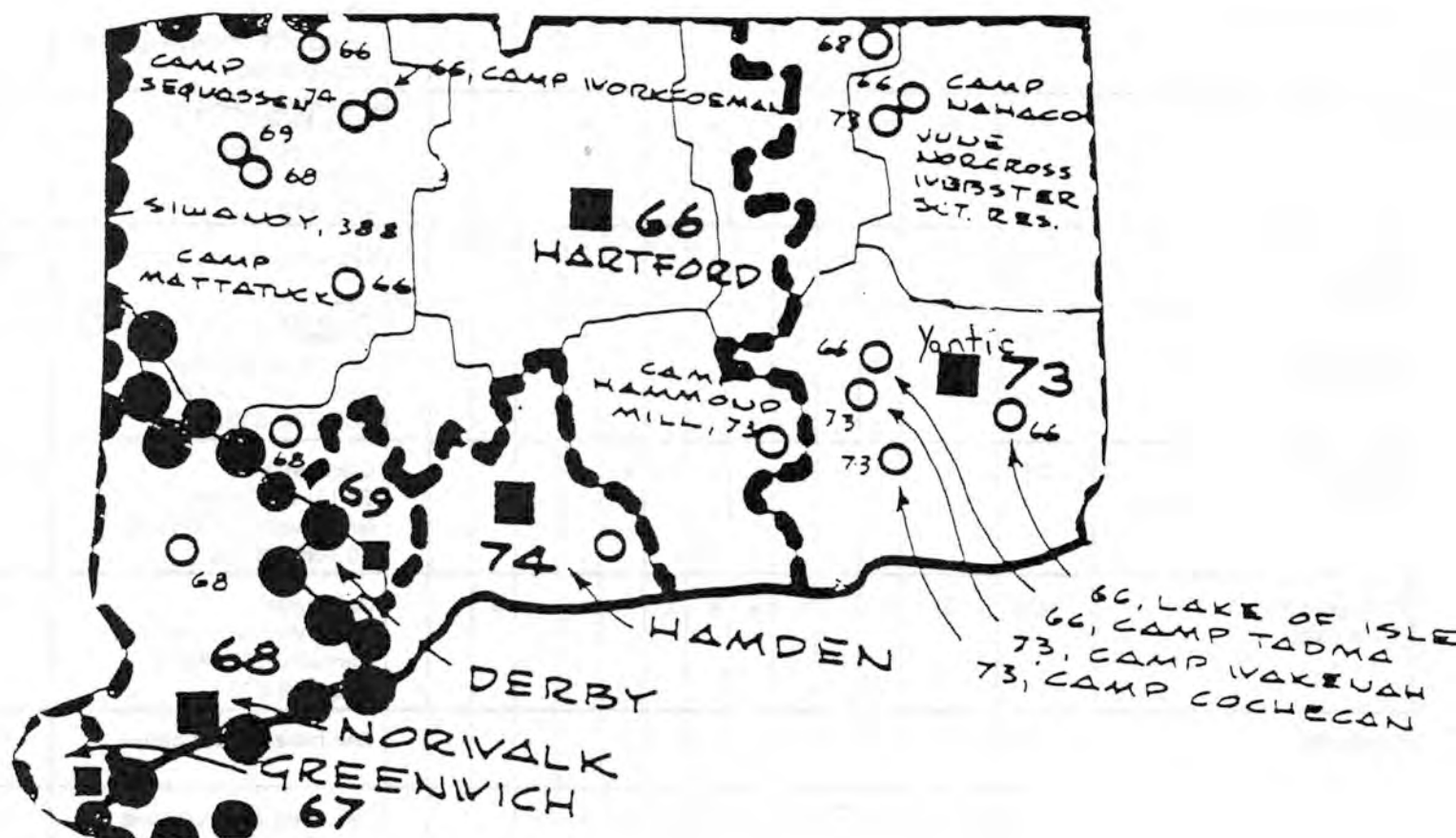
- ? - Water area unknown. No information at publication time.
- P - Swimming Pool
- R - River or stream for boating and canoeing
- S - Lake under 10 acres for swimming, boating, canoeing
- M - Lake 10-50 acres for swimming, boating, canoeing and possible limited sailing
- L - Lake 50-200 acres for swimming, boating, canoeing, sailing
- LM - Lake 50-200 acres for swimming, boating, canoeing, sailing, plus motor boating and water skiing
- XL - Extra large lake - usually shared with other property owners with the same camp providing a full program of aquatics activities including motor boating and water skiing
- XLR - Motor boats restricted - not permitted by lake owners or the camp. Extra large lake providing everything except motor boating and water skiing
- XLP - Motor boating and water skiing permitted but equipment not provided by camp. Personal equipment permitted with proper supervision

Year-Round Facilities - Summer Programs

The coding for these twelve columns is:

- TC - Site available for overnight TENT CAMPING
- AD - ADIRONDACK (lean-to) shelters for overnight use
- WC - WINTER CABINS for overnight use
- FC - FAMILY CAMPING sites (an "*" below X indicates trailer hookups)
- AF - ACTIVITY FIELD for athletics and camporees
- BC - BOATS AND CANOES available for overnight groups
- CD - Organized CUB DAY CAMP program offered
- DH - DINING HALL summer Scout camp
- PC - PATROL COOKING summer Scout camp
- HA - HIGH ADVENTURE programs offered (extended backpacking and/or canoe trips)
- CO - COPE Course
- CC - EXTENDED CUB CAMPING

TRANSPORTATION

1. You will enforce reasonable travel speed in accordance with state and local laws in all motor vehicles.
2. If by motor vehicle:
 - a. *Driver Qualifications:* All drivers must have a valid driver's license and be at least 18 years of age. **Youth Member Exception:** When traveling to an area, regional, or national Boy Scout activity or any Explorer event under the leadership of an adult (21+) tour leader, a youth member at least 16 years of age may be a driver, subject to the following conditions: (1) Six months' driving experience as a licensed driver (time on a learner's permit or equivalent is not to be counted); (2) no record of accidents or moving violations; (3) parental permission has been granted to leader, driver, and riders; (4) a 21-year-old licensed driver must be a passenger in the vehicle.

- b. If the vehicle to be used is designed to carry 15 or more persons (including driver) the driver must have a commercial driver's license (CDL).

- c. Driving time is limited to a maximum of 12 hours and must be interrupted by frequent rest, food, and recreation stops.
- d. Seat belts are provided, *and must be used*, by all passengers and driver. *Exception:* A school or commercial bus.
- e. Passengers will ride only in the cab if trucks are used.

OUR PLEDGE OF PERFORMANCE

1. We will use the Safe Swim Defense in any water activity.

11. We will not cut standing trees or shrubs without specific permission from the landowner or manager.
12. We will collect only souvenirs that are gifts to us or that we purchase.
13. We will pay our own way and not expect concessions or entertainment from any individual or group.
14. We will provide every member of our party an opportunity to attend religious services on the Sabbath.
15. We will observe the courtesy to write thank-you notes to persons who assisted us on our trip.
16. We will, in case of backcountry expedition, read and abide by the Wilderness Use Policy of the BSA.
17. We will notify, in case of serious trouble, our local council service center, our parents, or other local contact.
18. If more than one vehicle is used to transport our group, we will establish rendezvous points at the start of each day and not attempt to have drivers closely follow the group vehicle in front of them.
